- Year GSP first instituted: **1976**
- Total U.S. imports under GSP (January-December 2015): **\$17.4 billion**
- Number of GSP beneficiary countries and territories: **122**
- Number of GSP beneficiaries that are least developed countries (LDCs): **43**
- Total number of 8-digit U.S. tariff lines eligible for duty-free entry under GSP: **4,987**
 - of these, number eligible for all GSP beneficiaries: **3,509**
 - number eligible for LDC beneficiaries only: **1,478**
